The Office of Student Needs and the Office of Student Equity partnered to create the Zine Booklet, providing crucial guidance for students seeking legal name changes. The Outreach Team has been busy hosting college fairs, workshops, and campus visits, engaging with over 400 students. Notable events included Hair Cuts of Change and celebrations for Women's History Month, alongside the commencement of the VRC Office Olympics. In March we also saw significant achievements, such as a high number of graduation petitions and record applications for Middle College & College Advantage programs. A generous donation from the Saratoga-Monte Sereno Community Foundation of \$9,000 was acquired by the Director of Student Needs, which will aid housing insecure students. Lastly, on March 27th, WVC hosted the Black Student Summit, with 16 high schools RSVPing and approximately 200 students in attendance, further highlighting the college's dedication to fostering diversity and inclusion.
